Administrators in Nova Scotia have responded quickly by putting in place the very best known infection control measures to protect your loved ones and their staff who have the honour of caring for them. A few of these measures include; restricting visitors to nursing homes with the exception of family members who are supporting their loved ones near end of life stages; screening and monitoring staff and residents daily for signs and symptoms of this virus; limiting the number of residents who can gather, and practicing social distancing among residents and staff as much as possible.

We recognize that these restrictions are difficult on families and their loved ones. Many nursing homes have adopted technology in an effort to keep those important connections alive by using social platforms such as Facebook, Zoom and Facetime for virtual visits. We are pleased to see that the NS Government recognizes the importance of these connections with the purchase of 800 new IPADs for Long Term Care facilities to use over the coming weeks.

Unfortunately, COVID 19 is now in our community and is impacting three nursing homes and a retirement complex. While this is not unexpected, it is unsettling. We are working closely with public health, and our government partners DHW and NSHA to implement further restrictions and measures to minimize the spread.
